Background

Agriculture across the Asia-Pacific region is increasingly vulnerable to climate change. Rising temperatures, erratic rainfall, droughts and floods are affecting agricultural productivity, food security and rural livelihoods. At the same time, countries must meet growing food demand while transitioning to sustainable, low-carbon and resource-efficient production systems. Technology and innovation are therefore central to building climate-resilient agriculture and achieving sustainable development.

Bioeconomy offers a promising pathway to address these challenges by promoting the sustainable use of biological resources to produce food, bio-based materials and energy. Emerging technologies—including climate-smart and precision agriculture, agricultural biotechnology, digital agriculture, artificial intelligence, remote sensing and circular bio-based value chains—can improve productivity, strengthen resilience, enhance resource efficiency and create new opportunities for green growth and rural livelihoods. Realizing this potential, however, requires supportive policies, investment, technology transfer and stronger regional cooperation.

The conference is aligned with **ESCAP Resolution 82/2, "Supporting the transition towards a sustainable bioeconomy in countries in Asia and the Pacific"** adopted in April 2026. The resolution calls on member States to strengthen research, innovation, human capacities and financing, promote digital technologies and artificial intelligence, foster public-private partnerships, and enhance regional cooperation to accelerate a sustainable and inclusive bioeconomy transition.

Against this backdrop, the ***International Conference on Technology and Innovation for Climate Resilient Agriculture and Bioeconomy*** on December 2, 2026, at Changsha in China will provide a regional platform for knowledge exchange and policy dialogue on climate-smart agriculture, agricultural biotechnology, digital technologies, artificial intelligence, financing and regional cooperation. The conference will bring together policymakers, researchers, industry leaders, innovators and development partners to share experiences, showcase technological solutions and strengthen partnerships for advancing climate-resilient agriculture and a sustainable bioeconomy across the Asia-Pacific region.

Target audience

Policymakers and government officials, researchers, technology providers and innovators, private sector and financing institutions, and development partners from across Asia and the Pacific working on climate-resilient agriculture and the bioeconomy.

Objectives

1. **Enhanced knowledge:** Participants will gain insights into the latest advancements in emerging technologies and their applications in climate-resilient agriculture and bioeconomy.
2. **Collaborative networking and regional cooperation:** The conference will encourage new partnerships and cross-border collaborations among scientists, technologists and policymakers.
3. **Policy recommendations:** The conference will help develop useful recommendations for enabling policies to support the integration and application of emerging technologies in climate resilient agriculture and bioeconomy and foster cross-border technology cooperation.

SESSION DETAILS

TECHNICAL SESSION: Technologies for Climate-Smart and Precision Agriculture for Climate Resilience This session will examine technologies and approaches that help farming systems withstand and adapt to climate shocks, from resilient crop genetics to precision water and risk management. Presentation topics (suggested): 1. Stress-tolerant and climate-resilient crop varieties, seed systems 2. Precision farming, digital tools and water-efficient/climate-adaptive irrigation 3. Climate risk monitoring and early-warning systems for farm-level decisions
TECHNICAL SESSION: Agri-Biotechnology, Digital Technologies and AI for a Sustainable Bioeconomy This session will explore how biotechnology, digital tools and artificial intelligence are driving innovation, transparency and circularity across bioeconomy value chains. Presentation topics (suggested): 1. Agricultural biotechnology, seed innovation and bio-based products/biomanufacturing 2. AI and digital tools for traceability, transparency and quantifying bioeconomy across value chains 3. Circular, waste-to-value and bioenergy technologies
TECHNICAL SESSION: Policy framework for Bioeconomy Transition This session will discuss the policy frameworks including financing instruments and investment strategies needed to mobilize capital for a sustainable, inclusive bioeconomy transition. Presentation topics (suggested): 1. National policies and policy instruments 2. Blended finance, green bonds and public-private partnerships 3. De-risking and investment facilitation instruments 4. Prioritizing MSMEs, smallholders, community enterprises and start-ups
PANEL DISCUSSION: Regional Cooperation for a Sustainable Bioeconomy Transition This session will address the policy, standards and cooperation mechanisms needed to scale bioeconomy solutions equitably across the region. Member State representatives will be part of this panel discussion.
